WHEREAS, with leadership, dedication, and encouragement, there is compelling evidence that we can be successful in reducing sexual violence in Middlesex County through prevention education focused on increasing gender equity and bystander intervention, increased awareness, and holding perpetrators who commit acts of violence responsible for their actions; and

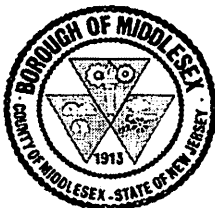

Dear Mayor DiMuro:

I am pleased to inform you that your community has been selected to receive funding from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) Fiscal Year 2016 Municipal Aid Program for Warrenton Ave. Road Improvements in the amount of \$353,700.

NJDOT's Municipal Aid Program is a very competitive program. This year the Department received 641 applications requesting more than \$253 million. There is \$78.75 million available in funds from the Transportation Trust Fund (TTF).

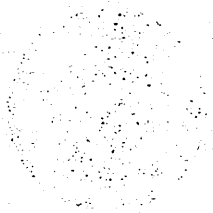
