**RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE DETAILS OF
THE SALE OF GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS
OF THE BOROUGH OF MIDDLESEX, IN THE
COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY, TO THE
NEW JERSEY ENVIRONMENTAL
INFRASTRUCTURE TRUST AND THE STATE OF
NEW JERSEY PURSUANT TO THE 2004 NEW
JERSEY ENVIRONMENTAL INFRASTRUCTURE
TRUST FINANCING PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Middlesex (the "Borough"), in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Borough to acquire, construct, renovate or install the Project (the "Project") as defined in each of that certain Loan Agreement (the "Trust Loan Agreement") to be entered into by and between the Borough and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (the "Trust") and that certain Loan Agreement (the "Fund Loan Agreement", and together with the Trust Loan Agreement, the "Loan Agreements") to be entered into by and between the Borough and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (the "State"), all pursuant to the 2004 New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust Financing Program (the "Program");

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined to finance the acquisition, construction, renovation or installation of the Project with the proceeds of a loan to be made by each of the Trust (the "Trust Loan") and the State (the "Fund Loan", and together with the Trust Loan, the "Loans") pursuant to the Trust Loan Agreement and the Fund Loan Agreement, respectively;

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loans, each of the Trust and the State require the Borough to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Borough's General Improvement Bonds to the Trust (the "Trust Loan Bond") and to the State (the "Fund Loan Bond", and together with the Trust Loan Bond, the "Bonds") in a combined aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,800,000, pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey (the "Local Bond Law"), other applicable law, the Loan Agreements and the Escrow Agreement dated September 7, 2004 (the "Escrow Agreement") by and among the Trust, the State, the Borough and the escrow agent named therein;

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2) of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Trust Loan Bond and the Fund Loan Bond to the Trust and the State, respectively, without any public offering, and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9(a) allows for the sale of the Trust Loan Bond to the Trust, without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms of the Escrow Agreement, the Trust has sold its bonds to fund the Trust Loan, thereby enabling the Borough to confirm the exact aggregate principal amount of and debt service schedule for the Bonds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough as follows:

Section 1. The sale of the Trust Loan Bond to the Trust and the Fund Loan Bond to the State is hereby confirmed. The Trust Loan Bond shall be released from escrow in accordance with the terms of the Escrow Agreement and thereby issued in accordance with the principal loan amount, interest rates and maturity schedule set forth in Schedule A attached hereto and made a part hereof. The Fund Loan Bond shall be released from escrow in accordance with the terms of the Escrow Agreement and thereby issued in accordance with the maturity schedule set forth on Schedule B attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 3. Upon the adoption hereof, the Borough Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to McManimon & Scotland, L.L.C., bond counsel to the Borough and McCarter & English, LLP, bond counsel to the Trust.

Mayor Dobies opened the public portion of the meeting for comments or questions.

Frank Ryan, 303 Maple Street – Stated his concern regarding the armoring of the dam and the punch list that was not done. There was approximately \$16,000 held from the contractor until the job was done, and there are several items on the punch list that have not been done. Mayor Dobies suggested taking this money and completing the work and using some money to do the dam. Mayor Dobies thinks the commitment date for the contractor has passed. If they do not come back the engineer will send a letter that we are going after the bonding company. Mr. Ryan recommended that some of the areas that need seeding could be done by the DPW in order to get the job done and back charge the contractor. The Borough Attorney indicated that you have to give the performance bond company an opportunity to do the work or we could be jeopardized.

Mr. Ryan’s second concern is about the pine trees at the soccer field. He indicated that the contractor has backfilled against 5 – 6 of the trees. This dirt must be grated. Mayor Dobies indicated that this should be taken care of once the sodding is complete.

Betty Platten, 4 Hooker Avenue questioned if the campaign literature sent out by the Council President had been paid for by the borough.

John McGuire, 401 Ashland Road commended the governing body on the great job that was done with the 9/11 Memorial Ceremony on Saturday. Mr. McGuire also stated his concern with the amount of demolition in town of old structures, because he found a sink hole at his relative’s property on Douglas Lane and slabs of concrete were dug up. He would like to know who is overseeing these projects that are being demolished and rebuilt.

Councilman Mulcahy suggested that more sturdy fencing be put up at MountainView Park because it will be there up until at least May. Borough Administrator will contact contractor regarding this fencing.

Councilwoman Thomasey moved the appointment of Michael Class to Parker Hose Company seconded by Councilman Mulcahy and carried by a unanimous vote.

Mayor Dobies moved the appointment of Michael Lally to the Economic Development committee seconded by Councilman Hompesch and carried by a unanimous vote.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned by Councilman D’Angelo and seconded by Councilwoman Liana and carried by unanimous vote of Council.
