**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body has recommended that in the event of a safety emergency Willow Drive be reopened to vehicular traffic as a one way street, entering from Route 28 and exiting from Mohawk Avenue; and

**WHEREAS**, the remainder of Willow Drive will be opened only to pedestrian traffic; and

**WHEREAS**, the Park shall open at sunrise and shall close at 9 P.M. from September 1 through May 31 and close at 10 P.M. from June 1 through August 31.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Middlesex, County of Middlesex and State of New Jersey that:

1. Victor Crowell Park shall be reopened for a 90 day period effective December 14, 2004 until such time as an ordinance can be adopted from sunrise and shall close at 9 P.M. from September 1 through May 31 and close at 10 P.M. from June 1 through August 31.
2. On an emergency basis, Willow Drive shall be reopened as a one way street, for vehicular traffic entering from Route 28 and exiting from Mohawk Avenue. The remainder of Willow Drive will be reopened only to pedestrian and bicycle traffic.
3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Council President Hompesch proposed an amendment to the resolution to change the date that the park will reopen to be December 21, 2004. He proposed this amendment so that the council would be able to hold another Agenda Meeting and another Public Meeting, in order to allow the public the opportunity to be made aware of the opening of the park and also address some of the concerns regarding the planning, safety and the exact location of the vehicular traffic. Mayor Dobies stated that he was in opposition to moving the date, because the Victor Crowell Park is an Advisory Committee and the Council should make a decision.

Council President Hompesch moved to amend the resolution to state that it would be reopened effective December 21, 2004 seconded by Councilman Mulcahy and carried by the following roll call votes: Ayes: Members Colitti, D'Angelo, Hompesch, Liana, Mulcahy and Thomasey. Nos.: None. Abstain: None.

Council President Hompesch moved for adoption seconded by Councilman Mulcahy and carried by the following roll call votes: Ayes: Members Hompesch, Liana, Mulcahy and Thomasey. Nos.: Colitti and D'Angelo. Abstain: None.

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Mayor Dobies opened the public portion of the meeting for comments or questions.

Patti McGuire, 401 Ashland Road questioned the urgency to open the park after being closed for 6 years, because she does not want to confuse people opening and closing the park. She also questioned how much money is left for the Victor Crowell Park project and what is the next step for the Committee. The ad hoc committee wants to work together and she feels that it is taking much too long to complete this project. She did not expect to make decisions when she was put on the committee, but to provide input and be heard. The committee was never provided information regarding the Memorial Plaza and they were not kept in the loop. She is looking forward to January and getting the project done.

Marion Spilatro, 133 Giles Avenue spoke regarding her sidewalk and the fact that she was told when she inquired about her sidewalk buckling that she did not own the sidewalk, but she was required to fix it. She then had her sidewalk leveled and she feels that her neighbors should also be required to replace their sidewalk.

Karen Rutkowski, 211 Maple Street, a member of the Victor Crowell Park Committee is concerned about safety. After the master plan was approved, it included closing the road, and she feels that the council should have come back to the committee before opening the park. She is discouraged after all the time spent by the committee, that a decision was made and no one was notified.

Frank Ryan, 303 Maple Street stated that the mission statement indicated that the Committee would serve as an advisory committee to make recommendations on any action that is taken at Victor Crowell Park. When the council voted to open the park, he was taken aback that the Committee was not contacted about any input. The Committee is asking if the Mayor and Council would like to meet with them or walk around the park to discuss different items at the park.

Chester Sadowski, 206 Cedar Avenue spoke regarding the owner of the property across the street from his home and stated that it seems that the landlord is unaware of the garbage problem and leaf problem on the property.

Ed Johnson, 216 Hazelwood Road, indicated that he is disappointed that the council has agreed to go out to bid for the bikeway. He stated that Mike Schneider pointed out on behalf of the Environmental Commission that taking down 70 trees has an effect on the ecosystem of the area, and by taking away the high growth the low growth will not prosper. He pointed out that there are some combination bikeways and walkways, but most in areas where there are abandoned railroads easements. The area behind the high school is a nature walkway and by taking down the trees it does not have any value as a nature walkway. He also stated his concern that the money spent on this bikeway does not make for good fiscal responsibility, as in excess of \$140,000 has been spent and we have received a grant for \$50,000. He thinks we will have a lot of environmental and ecological problems from this bikeway.

Mike Schneider, 440 High Street as a resident questioned where the parking is at Victor Crowell Park and stated that he feels that the Victor Crowell Park would be a great place for a bike trail.

As Chairman of the Environmental Commission, Mike Schneider stated that he would like to persuade the Council not to move ahead on this bike path. He is concerned that it is poorly planned and that the community was not on board with the planning and engineering phase. Some of the problems were rectified, but as stated in his letter of August, 2003 from the Environmental Commission, the engineer did not take the recommendations of the Commission regarding the width of the bike path and the Environmental Commission's concern for the removal of all the trees. Mike Schneider read Resolution #86-99 which was adopted by the Mayor & Council in 1999 which designated the "Greenway – Nature Trail" and he questioned if what happened with this resolution was going to happen to other resolutions that are adopted by the Mayor and Council

Bob Schueler, 58 Marlborough Avenue, reminded the Mayor and Council of the problem that happened in 1995 – 1996 when 70 trees came down and people were very angry. Children take the path of least resistance, and if we circumvent the path, he doubts the path will be heavily used.

Bruce Sadowski, 109 Lee Drive indicated that he can appreciate Mike Schneider's comments because he cares about the environment.

Seeing that there was no further public participation, Mayor Dobies closed the public portion of the meeting.

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Councilman D'Angelo moved the approval of the October, 2004 Treasurer's Report seconded by Council President Hompesch and carried by a unanimous vote of Council.

Councilman Mulchay moved the approval of the October, 2004 Police Department Report seconded by Council President Hompesch and carried by a unanimous vote of Council.

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There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned by Councilman Colitti and seconded by Councilwoman Liana and carried by unanimous vote of Council.
